### USERNAME - EMAIL ADDRESS - PASSWORD

Changes to any of the above personal website details requires a **secure Validation (UNLOCK) Code** which, by sending it to your email address, will only be available to you.

Security is provided in the fact that your email address is unique and no-one else should know your password or be able to access it.

#### USERNAME

It is recommended that you use your own name so that:

1. When you invite others to participate in a competition they will know who it is from.
2. When you receive an invitation you will know who has sent it.
3. You will recognise all participants listed in competition results.
4. If another User with the same name has already registered then just add anything to distinguish between you  
e.g. extra initial - Sam **J** Lee, number - Sam Lee **02**  
home venue - Sam Lee **Belfry** etc.

#### EMAIL ADDRESS

This enables the website to provide **individual security** as your **Personal Details** can only be changed by entering a **Validation Code**.

This **Code** is issued to your email address to ensure only you receive it.

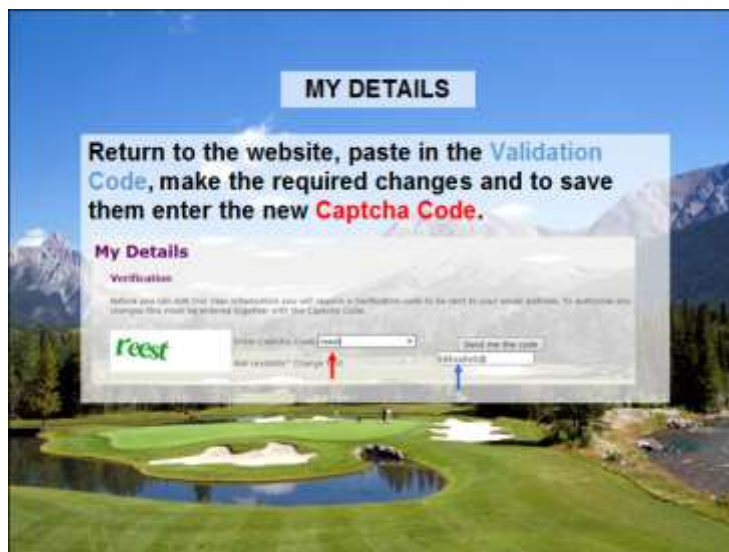
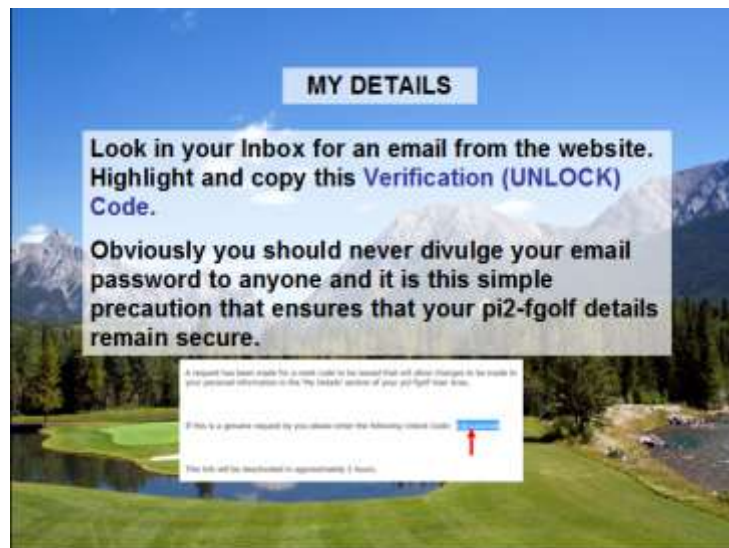
#### PASSWORD

As with any other website it is important that you **do not share** your password with anyone.

The password must contain at least **EIGHT** mixed characters and be something of relevance to you (easily remembered) but not to anyone else.

For example: **\*Paris150824**

If this section of the User Guide is available then you have registered as being one of the **eight** incumbent (**pi2-fgolf** specified) **OFFICIALS** of your golf club.



## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

As an identified club official you will enjoy the following **additional** features.

**Free 365-day access renewable each year for incumbents.**

**Full editing control of the scorecard data submitted.**

**Ability to create fund-raising competitions involving your members.**



## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

**FREE 365-day access renewable each year.**

1. The club will receive a renewal email each year.
2. Whoever receives this email should forward a copy to each of the identified incumbent officers so that they can all enjoy their free 365-day access. This **MUST** be done before anyone uses the original email to register
3. Once you receive a copy of this email click on the **link**.
3. Register and claim your position from the drop-down list of officials.

EDITING CONTROL OF THE CLUB/COURSE DATA.

This feature is available at the foot of your My Details tab



A separate Data Capture form is required for each tee on each course **IF THEIR DATA DIFFERS IN ANY WAY**.  
To add a new tee just increase the number of data capture forms required

Each Data Capture form requires the following scorecard details:

1. Course name
2. Tee colour
3. No. of holes (18-hole course / 9-hole course etc.)
4. Course Rating (CR) and Slope (or only SSS if applicable)
5. Hole Par and Stroke Index/Handicap
6. Front 9 Par - Back 9 Par - Course Par

~~9-hole courses / 6-hole courses / 12-hole courses etc.~~  
must all be entered with 18-hole scorecards

A Par value and Stroke Index/Handicap is then required for all 18 holes

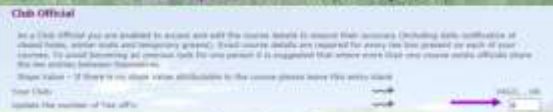
MY DETAILS  
CLUB OFFICIALS

As already indicated, a separate data capture form needs to be completed for every tee box on each course

For example:


If you have 2 courses each of which has 3 tee boxes  
(Red - Yellow - White)

If ANY course data differs on these (e.g. Course Rating/SSS) then 6 data capture forms will be required.

This will then provide six data capture forms:

CLUB OFFICIALS

To add/edit the data simply enter the relevant text/values and click the Update Courses button.



MY DETAILS  
CLUB OFFICIALS

The website requires that each data capture form is competed in full.

This means that 9-hole, 13-hole, 7-hole courses etc. **must** be entered AS IF A FULL 18-HOLE COURSE.

- Course Par for 18 holes
- Course Rating/slope (or SSS) for 18 holes
- Stroke Index (hole handicap) for 18 holes

CLUB OFFICIALS

**9-HOLE COURSE**

Enter the course data **twice** but ensure that the Hole Handicaps are numbered 1-18

**MY DETAILS**  
CLUB OFFICIALS

**A 7-HOLE COURSE**

If the holes are to be played in the correct sequence:

Holes 1-4 will need to be entered **three times** each with a different Stroke Index/handicap  
They will then become holes 1-4, 8-11, 15-18

Holes 5-7 will need to be entered **twice** each with a different Stroke Index/handicap  
They will then become holes 5-7, 12-14

## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

Where a club has **3 separate 9-hole courses (A/B/C)** the total number of data capture forms required will not only depend on how many tee boxes each has but also whether:

Any two are to be played in the **same order** to complete an 18-hole round

Any two can be played in **any sequence** to complete an 18-hole round.

The key issue is whether the Hole Handicap sequence differs for each of the above.

## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

For Example:

Course combinations to be played in set order

1. Course A **THEN** Course B
2. Course A **THEN** Course C
3. Course B **THEN** Course C

There are in effect 3 courses available which will require a data capture form to be completed **FOR EACH TEE BOX** present.

So if there are **White / Yellow / Red** tees on each course and any **data differs** (e.g. Course Rating/SSS) then **(3x3) NINE** data capture forms will be required if

## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

If the **SAME** 9-hole course is played twice then treat as any other 9-hole course. This means there are now 6 course combinations available.

1. Course A / Course A
2. Course A / Course B
3. Course A / Course C
4. Course B / Course B
5. Course B / Course C
6. Course C / Course C

The number of data capture forms required will be determined by the tee boxes present

**MY DETAILS**  
**CLUB OFFICIALS**

If the Stroke Index is **fixed** for each hole it will not matter whether play actually starts on Course A (1<sup>st</sup>) or Course B (10<sup>th</sup>). Treat as though commencing on the 1<sup>st</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> on an 18-hole course.

Three data capture forms will need to be completed if there are 3 tee boxes on each.

Three 9-hole courses

The difficulty arises where the **order of the 2 courses** played **affects the hole handicap**.

For example:

Index 1 will be Index 1 of the first course played.

This in effect makes

Course A **THEN** Course B

Very different from

Course B **THEN** Course A

As these are in effect 2 different courses both have to be entered

So this means there are now **9 DIFFERENT** course combinations

1. Course A / Course A
2. Course A / Course B
3. Course A / Course C
4. Course B / Course B
5. Course B / Course C
6. Course B / Course A
7. Course C / Course C
8. Course C / Course A
9. Course C / Course B

If all 3 courses have the usual 3 tee boxes then (9 x 3) 27 data capture forms will be required

### CLUB OFFICIALS

Where more than three data capture forms are to be completed it is recommended that this task is shared between the eight officials.

## MY DETAILS

### CLUB OFFICIALS

The VA Golf Club has 2 courses

18-hole MAIN course (White tee: CR 76.1 SLOPE 145)

9-hole SMALL course (Yellow tee: CR 68.0 SLOPE N/A\*)

\*Leave the Slope box blank

The MAIN course has 4 tee boxes  
(Blue - White - Yellow - Red)

The SMALL course has only 2 tee boxes  
(Yellow - Red)

The website requires 6 data capture forms.

**Editing the club/course conditions**

The website also enables you to provide users with the specific **course conditions on a daily basis.**

- ☆ Winter mats (WM)
- ★ Temporary greens (TC) during these rounds
- ★ Holes closed (HC)




## ENTERING A SCORECARD

The pi2-fgolf© website is based on an **original** and **unique** concept/algorithm© that calculates the strokes **YOU** should **NORMALLY** take on a particular course.

To achieve this the website only requires details of the **date** and **course played** together with the **gross strokes** taken by you on each hole during that round of golf.

It is important therefore that the any hole **not completed** (ball picked up/lost) and **not played** (closed for maintenance) are clearly indicated.

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

### ENTERING THE FIRST SCORECARD

ALL courses listed on the [www.pi2-fgolf.com](http://www.pi2-fgolf.com) website are recorded to allow a full 18-hole round of golf to be assessed.

For this reason a value needs to be entered for each of the 18 holes on the selected data capture form.

If the first scorecard entered involves a round over 18 holes then enter the strokes taken on each hole.

It is where the **first scorecard** involved some of the 18 holes **not being played** or a **no/score** that a special requirement exists. Refer to 9-hole courses (6th illustration below)

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

### ENTERING THE FIRST SCORECARD

The **first scorecard entered** is extremely important as the website assumes that you have **never played golf** before this round and will be the starting point for all future assessments.

In order to provide a unique **pi2-fgolf assessment** the website requires some prior knowledge of your game.

For this reason **no assessment will be provided for the first three scorecards** entered.

The website will then use these to make an assessment of the 4<sup>th</sup> scorecard.

The first 20 assessments will tend to fluctuate as the data available is still relatively limited.



## ENTERING A SCORECARD

Enter the date – **OLDEST ROUND FIRST**  
Enter the Gross Strokes per hole  
**ENTER** / If you **did not complete the hole** (lost ball etc.)  
**ENTER 0** If you **did not play the hole** e.g. hole closed or only the front 9 holes played etc.  
Indicate whether any '**Gimmies**' (or Mulligans etc.) were taken during the round.

Scorecard Course Selection

Course Name & Year:

A value must be entered for all 18 holes. E.g. if a 9-hole course is only played then enter a value of '0' (zero) for each of the holes not played. The system will auto remove rounds played to the correct hole sequence (Holes 1 - 18).

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

### 9-HOLE COURSES

If only 9 holes are played then a **0 (ZERO)** must be entered for each of the 9 holes not played.

### IMPORTANT EXCEPTION

This does not apply if the **VERY FIRST** scorecard entered does not involve scores on all 18 holes.

**The first scorecard entered must have an actual score for all 18 holes.**

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

### 9-HOLE COURSES

In this case the **SAME VALUES MUST BE ENTERED FOR THE LAST 9 HOLES AS THE FIRST 9** actually played.

The **7** strokes taken on the **first hole** is also entered for the **10<sup>th</sup>** which wasn't played.

The **5** strokes taken on the **4<sup>th</sup>** is also entered as the **12<sup>th</sup>** score etc

The Back 9 will thus be identical to the front 9 played

This **only applies to the first round entered**, the **DNP (0 value)** must then be entered for holes not played during all further rounds.

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

### ENTERING THE FIRST SCORECARD

If the first scorecard involves a round of 18 holes but where one was **closed for repair**,

e.g. **Hole 11 Par 3 SI 8**

Enter the strokes taken on another **Par 3 whose SI is closest to 8**

e.g. **Hole 5 Par 3 SI 11**

This also applies for any hole played but not completed. ( / N/S)

#### Summary

The first scorecard must **NOT** CONTAIN ANY **0** OR **/**

## ENTERING A SCORECARD

Entering the **correct date that the round** was played is crucial and for this reason you are asked to double check and confirm this together with the Gross Strokes per hole before it will issue the assessment.



Once entered you will not be able to enter a round played prior to this date so always enter the **oldest** scorecard first

## 3. SCORECARD pi2-f ASSESSMENT AND ANALYSIS



### SCORECARD ASSESSMENT

When you close this assessment (by clicking on the X) it is saved and, together with the other rounds you've entered previously, will be used to assess your next round of golf.

The first pi2-f assessment is therefore based on the first 3 scorecards entered.

The **forty-second pi2-f assessment** will be based on the **forty-one scorecards** already entered. So obviously, the more scorecards used to evaluate your game the more accurate the assessment becomes.

### SCORECARD ASSESSMENT

Where a small number of scorecards have been entered what is considered a **NORMAL** round will fluctuate considerably meaning that assessments will tend to fluctuate between **DIRE** and especially **SUPER**.

However, as more rounds are submitted (**20+**) the website will be able to converge more accurately on the **NORMAL** and subsequent assessments will reflect this.

### SCORECARD ASSESSMENT

The website is **'DYNAMIC'** as the algorithm involved immediately re-calculates what is a **NORMAL** round for you each time you enter a scorecard.

It will recognise that your normal game has **improved** if a series of rounds assessed as **SUPER** have been entered. Therefore, what had been assessed as a **NORMAL** round a few months ago would now be assessed as a **POOR** one.

### SCORECARD ASSESSMENT

For this reason it is advised that for **pi2-golf COMPETITIONS**, assessment accuracy should be based on participants entering **a minimum of twenty scorecards/pi2-golf assessments**.

Similarly, for **TRUE ACCURACY** all scorecards must, wherever possible, be submitted irrespective of venue, course or tee played (and for both **social** and **competition** rounds).

## ANALYSING YOUR GOLF

The historical list of colour-coded assessments provide an immediate **at-a-glance summary** of how your golf is progressing.

Too many **reds/pinks** indicate that you are not playing as well as you normally do.

**Blacks/greys** indicate that you are enjoying better rounds than normal. All will have an affect on what is regarded as **NORMAL** for your next assessment.

## ANALYSING YOUR GOLF

Below is an example of a regular golfer.

Normal rounds together with some good and bad spells.

Note the **N/S (/)** and **DNP (0)** holes are also colour-coded

## ANALYSING YOUR GOLF

As already indicated, **pi2-fgolf** assessments are **'DYNAMIC'** in that each scorecard you enter provides an immediate, and updated reflection of your current level of play.

In the previous example, a final round score of 74 strokes played on 2014/02/01 was classed as a **NORMAL** round.

A more recent round of 74 strokes (played on 2014/07/04) was regarded as **POOR**.

This indicates that this player's game must have been improving slightly over those 5 months.

## ANALYSING YOUR GOLF

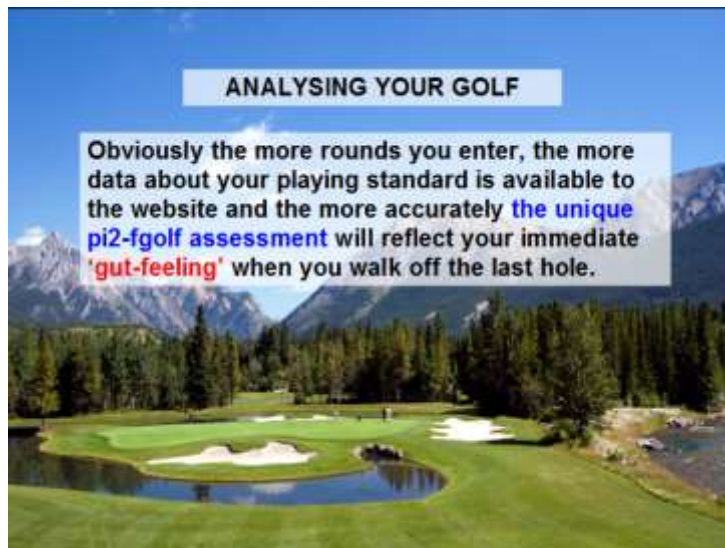
However for a more informative progress assessment select a period to review and change the data from words to points.

Obviously the more rounds you enter, the more data about your playing standard is available to the website and the more accurately the unique pi2-fgolf assessment will reflect your immediate 'gut-feeling' when you walk off the last hole.





## THE pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

Perhaps the most **unique feature** about this website is its ability to create and run **pi2-golf competitions** **WITHOUT HAVING TO ORGANISE A SPECIAL EVENT.**

- No need to timetable events in the busy annual golf calendar.
- No need to close the course to hold events.
- No need for participants to be present :

**at a specific course**

**on a specific day**

**at a specific time**

### pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

**With the few fund-raising exceptions outlined in the Terms and Conditions**  
**ALL pi2-golf competitions**  
**created by this website**  
**MUST BE FREE TO ENTER**

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

Your assessments are **unique and personal to you** indicating whether your latest round of golf is better or worse than the standard you normally play at.

The website simply considers the course being played and what score you should expect to complete it given your previous rounds.

### IT TRULY IS JUST YOU AGAINST THE COURSE

What it does not do is attempt to **EQUATE** your golf ability with another player and for this reason it **NEVER** requires/applies your **official golf handicap**.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

However, the website does **enable users to enjoy meaningful competition with one another**.

pi2-fgolf competitions are **unique** in that they

**DO NOT** involve the usual golf comparisons of:

- Which player took the **LEAST STROKES** to complete the round (with or without handicap allowances).
- Which player accumulated the **MOST STABLEFORD POINTS** when completing the round (with or without handicap allowances).

Instead, the competitions compare who played **BETTER/WORSE** than **NORMAL** when completing their round.

Furthermore, unlike total strokes/stableford points pi2-fgolf competitions can involve players whose rounds are played:

- On different courses (not for **ECLECTIC** competitions)
- In different countries
- On different days
- In different conditions

**INCLUDING THOSE ROUNDS THAT ARE INCOMPLETE**



### pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

All website users can create as many pi2-fgolf SOCIAL competitions as they wish but these must be **FREE-TO-ENTER** i.e. **NO ENTRY FEE REQUIREMENT** to participate (Terms & Conditions to apply at all times).

The **ONLY EXCEPTION** to this key condition of website use is where a **REGISTERED CLUB OFFICIAL** wishes to create such a competition but **entry must be restricted to their own members** and then only for the purpose of raising funds for their club or a named charity.



### pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

The Terms & Conditions implicitly indicates that **YOU** are only to accept an invitation to participate in a competition requiring an entry fee that has been sent by a **KNOWN OFFICIAL of a Golf Club you are a full member of**. These competition invitations will clearly **name the official** raising these funds and for what purpose.

The website recommends that such entry fees **MUST** be paid to **the NAMED OFFICIAL (or their representative)** at your golf club.



### pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

Should you ever receive a fee-paying invitation from **someone who is not a recognised incumbent official** at your club the **Terms & Conditions** clearly state that it is **ENTIRELY YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to **decline it**.

Failure to abide by this key website condition will result in the termination of your access to the **pi2-fgolf** website irrespective of the number of days remaining and competitions currently engaged in.

The first thing to note is that all competitions created **WILL BE FREE TO ENTER**. With strict exceptions (refer to Terms & Conditions) no-one is to request an entry fee to enter a pi2-golf competition created with this website.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

The website enables players to compare their individual assessments by creating (at present) **three types** of competitions:

1. The **pi2-golf original** format
2. The **pi2-golf eclectic** format
3. The **pi2-golf knock-out** format

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### The pi2-golf Original format

The selected scorecard assessments of each player are tabulated from SUPER – DIRE and positional points awarded.

Where more than one round is involved these points are accumulated.

Furthermore, it automatically provides separate table positions for:


**Full round - Front 9 round - Back 9 round**

**pi2-golf Individual Hole Eclectic**

Over the selected number of rounds the website identifies, and then only includes, the best performance on each hole to compile the **PERFECT** round over that period.

**pi2-golf Knock-out (As per Original Format above)**

Each round only scorecards of the remaining participants are available for selection. Those whose **pi2-golf assessments** are subsequently in the **BOTTOM HALF** of the table each round are then eliminated until only one remains.

The unique pi2-golf concept enables **ALL** of the scorecards to be eligible for the competition even though they have been played on **different courses and from varying tees**.

**RECENTLY-DATED** scorecards if for the **first** round.

Scorecards **DATED AFTER** the one entered in the **previous** round to ensure it cannot be included a second time.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

Where possible, scorecards should be selected for pi2-golf 'fun' competitions using the **following sequence of criteria** in order to **maintain consistency**:

- > Played on the **same day**
- > Played from the **same tee**
- > Played on the **same course**
- > No 'Gimmees', winter mats, closed holes or temporary greens. (all 4 stars present)

Ultimately though, having consulted the rest of the participants at the start the competition organiser decides the **'best fit'** scorecard to select each round.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

Even so, this sequence **will be difficult** to maintain where the competition involves players based in different parts of the world.

With this in mind the **two main criteria** to concentrate on when selecting a player's scorecard are:

1. From the **same course/tee\*** that the he/she normally plays on
2. On the **same day** (or nearest to) everyone else

\*As previously explained it makes no difference to any pi2-golf competition whether these are different for each participant

2. **HOME COURSE SCORECARD**  
If two or more home courses are available select one as the **preferred COMPETITION COURSE**.
3. **SOCIAL ROUNDS** Tee played from is not an issue i.e. **Blue/Black/White** or **Red/Green** tee. However, for **consistency** it is suggested to try and choose the same tee where possible.
4. **ANY OTHER SCORECARD AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION.**  
These will be scorecards of rounds **NOT PLAYED ON THE DESIGNATED COMPETITION COURSE**. All are equally valid for selection to any **pi2-golf competition formats** with the **exception of the eclectic**.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

There is a limit however, to how often the website will enter a calculated NORMAL ROUND for a player during the course of a competition.

Once this limit is reached the accumulated points of that player will no longer apply to the table rankings (0 total) due to lack of participation.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### Points v Most Improved tables

The Accumulated tables are compiled according to the total ranking points (plus bonuses) from each round.

However, rather than basing the competition on ranking points the website provides an alternative to this by identifying which player has actually improved the most (deteriorated the least) over the course of the competition.

This is the recommended option for club officials to use when running competitions involving more than one round to raise funds for the club or a charity.

It ensures that the competition will not result in a tie – a situation which is likely to occur where accumulated ranking points determine the outcome (equal total accumulated points).

**Invitations** to participate in any pi2-f competition created for the purpose of raising funds must be **restricted to members of that official's single golf club**.

**FUND-RAISING**

SUGGESTED pi2-fgolf PROCEDURE

The **CLUB OFFICIAL ORGANISING THE COMPETITION** is free to decide on the most suitable method of utilising the pi2-fgolf website for the purpose of raising funds from members of the golf club.

However, given the design structure of the website the following procedure is recommended:

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### FUND-RAISING

#### SUGGESTED pi2-golf PROCEDURE

Notify the members of the intention to run a club pi2-golf competition clearly identifying:

- The **official solely responsible**
- The **purpose** of any funds raised
- **Prizes\*** to be awarded
- **Entry Fee** and closing date
- **Competition dates**

\*The winner's prize could be in the form of:

1. Being presented with a new Club Trophy and name added to a Winners' Board displayed in the clubhouse.
2. Being invited to accompany the competition organiser when donating the funds raised to the designated charity on behalf of the golf club

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### FUND-RAISING

#### SUGGESTED pi2-golf PROCEDURE

#### PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:

1. In the **first instance** members register their interest by providing the official with their **website Username and email address**.
2. The only qualification is that their User Area already has a **minimum of 20 pi2-f assessments**.
3. If sufficient interest shown the official can then decide whether to go ahead and create the intended **fund-raising pi2-golf competition**.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

So if **270** members indicate an interest in a Charity Fundraiser you should consider creating **THREE separate competitions\*** each involving **90** participants:

\* Refer to the section **ADDITIONAL COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS** on how to determine an overall winner

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

On payment of the Entry Fee use the **Manage Invites** button to enter the member's pi2-fgolf username to send them their invitation in the normal way.

**THE OFFICIAL MUST RESTRICT INVITES TO CLUB MEMBERS ONLY (as per T&C).**

Set a **closing date** by which everyone has to respond to the invitation and, if accepted, pay the entry/donation fee.

By accepting the invitation the participant **IS AGREEING** to submit **ALL ROUNDS OF GOLF** he/she plays for pi2-fgolf assessment.

Once started, those who have not responded and paid the will **not be able to participate**.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

Ideally run the competition over a period of **at least 10 weeks**.

This ensures that all participants are able to play and **enter as many rounds as possible** allowing for **holidays, illness** etc.

Set a **minimum** number of scorecards to be entered by each participant during this competition period (e.g. 6).

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

For complete fairness it is recommended that **at the end of the competition** a **random date** is selected from the period involved.

The competition organiser then selects a scorecard from each participant on or nearest that date.

This ensures that **no participant knows beforehand which of their scorecards** will actually be involved

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

If more than one round is involved then **randomly** choose a date within the competition period **for each round**.

These dates **MUST** be allocated to each round in **chronological order** (earliest for round 1 etc.)

In such cases the official will need to notify participants **before starting the competition** whether **accumulated points** or **actual improvement (recommended)** will be applied to determine the winner

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

If numbers mean that **more than one competition** is created then an **overall winner** needs to be identified.

This can be easily achieved by **creating a further competition** sending **invitations to the top player\*** of each competition.

Using the **same selection process (same scorecards if available)** the website will rank them accordingly to select the **overall winner**.

If **THREE** are to be awarded then invite the **top 3 players** from each

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A FUND-RAISING COMPETITION

Again, if numbers mean that **more than one competition** the official can always **delegate** the creation of each of these additional competitions to **fellow officials**.

However, the **official initially proposing a fund-raising competition** to the members is **ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE** – especially the collection of **entry fees**.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A pi2-golf FUND-RAISING COMPETITION FOR A CHARITY

When raising funds for any charity it is the responsibility of the official proposing such to not just rely on the website to do so but PERSONALLY notify the charity of his/her intentions and TAKE FULL RESPONSIBILITY for ensuring that all money raised is received by that charity.

The pi2-golf website merely facilitates the running of competitions and as per the T&C's will not be held responsible for any deliberate misuse by any Club Official regarding the raising of funds.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A pi2-golf FUND-RAISING COMPETITION FOR A CHARITY

It is essential that when identifying a competition winner all conditions are met in full.

Apart from the obvious (paid the entry fee/donation etc.) the organiser needs to be satisfied that all rounds of golf played by that person have, where possible, been submitted for pi2-golf assessment.

This ensures that the assessments are FAIR to all participants.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### CREATING A pi2-golf FUND-RAISING COMPETITION FOR A CHARITY

One way to achieve this is to set a condition from the outset.

e.g. A minimum of THREE scorecard assessments per round.


In the event of any query or dispute ALL participants must allow club officials to view their pi2-golf scorecard history to scrutinise dates, GROSS SCORES ACTUALLY ENTERED and subsequent pi2-golf assessments.

ONCE OFFICIALS HAVE VERIFIED THAT THESE ARE IN ORDER PRIZES CAN THEN BE AWARDED.



## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

In fact, as the [pi2-fgolf.com](http://pi2-fgolf.com) website records the majority of rounds played by an individual and not just those of competitions, it could provide an immediate reference source to help resolve many golfing issues and disputes.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-fgolf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

This is run in exactly the same way as an **original pi2-fgolf competition** except that:

The original pi2-fgolf competition compares the overall round assessment of each player i.e. who played better than normal.

The pi2-fgolf eclectic only includes the **best result for each hole** from all the rounds selected for a participant during the competition.

It then uses **only these** to compile a **PERFECT ROUND** for that player to compare with the other competitors.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

#### IMPORTANT CONTROL

As this competition is seeking the best score on each particular hole from the scorecards entered it is VITAL that the same hole data is being analysed each time a scorecard is entered.

To ensure this is complied with ONLY SCORECARDS FOR THE SAME COURSE/TEE are to be selected for each round of the competition.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

To ensure consistency the sequence of holes played must be identical having the same par and stroke index for each round e.g.

Hole	1	2	3	4.....
Par	4	3	4	5.....
Index	17	11	2	10.....

Furthermore the course must have the same

COURSE PAR – SSS or

COURSE RATING - SLOPE

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

This can only be GUARANTEED if scorecards from the same course and tee are selected each round.



pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

WHY THIS IS IMPORTANT

If the **first hole** on the course is a **par 5** then the **best** most golfers can usually expect to complete this hole will be **4 strokes (birdie)** with the extremely rare eagle 3.



pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

WHY THIS IS IMPORTANT

If however, a **round played on another course** is entered into the competition where the **first hole is a par 3** then it is quite possible that this could be completed in **2 strokes** (or even **a hole-in-one**)  
As the website is identifying the **best score on the first hole to include** then it will **unfairly recognise** the 2 strokes taken.



pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

This doesn't mean that every player has to play on the same course to participate.

Each can play on a different course and tee but scorecards must be selected from the **SAME ONE** throughout the eclectic competition

Select scorecards only for:

Player A River Golf Course (Red tee)

Player B Forest Golf Course (Yellow tee)



## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

As individual handicaps are never applied (or even requested) by the website another issue that arises with regards a pi2-f eclectic competition involves players of differing abilities.

To explain this you only need to consider an extremely good golfer with an average one.



## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

On the SAME course the skillful golfer (player A) may regularly complete a difficult par 4 in the regulation 4 strokes. During a 10-round eclectic competition there may be an occasion when he completes it in only 3 strokes

The weaker golfer (player B) may normally complete this hole in 6 or more strokes but over the same period there is every chance that he may play it once to par (4 strokes).



## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION

As the website is compiling a PERFECT ROUND by only including the best score for each hole the 3 strokes will be entered for player A's round and 4 strokes for the weaker player B.

However, when it comes to assessing these two perfect rounds the website will recognise that the completion of this hole in 4 strokes represents a far bigger improvement for player B than that of the 3 strokes by player A.

**pi2-golf COMPETITIONS**

**THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION**

Obviously, this situation could arise on a number of different holes throughout the **10-rounds** of the eclectic competition.

Taken as a whole the website will identify the **PERFECT ROUND** of **player B** as being **far better** that of **player A**.



**pi2-golf COMPETITIONS**

**THE pi2-golf ECLECTIC COMPETITION**

As **this anomaly will always occur** every time a **pi2-golf eclectic competition** is created the website provides a **measure to counteract this advantage** gained by the weaker player when **regularly participating with the same group of players**.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-fgolf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

Any knockout competition requires the field to be reduced by half until only 1 remains.

This can only be achieved with the following number of participants:

1, 2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 128, 256, 512.....

It is for this reason that the maximum number of participants for ANY of the pi2-fgolf competition formats is limited to a maximum of 128

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-fgolf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

Any knockout competition requires the field to be

1, 2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 128, 256, 512.....

So a knockout competition with 19 entrants will have to be reduced by 3 to 16 in order to meet the above progression.



pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-fgolf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

During each round of a knockout competition scorecards are selected in the usual way.

However, once the round is completed only scorecards for those in the top half are made available for the next round.

This, in effect, eliminates the bottom half.




pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-fgolf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

If there is no scorecard available to select for a participant the website does not calculate a NORMAL round for inclusion.

Instead the Player is positioned at the bottom of the table and eliminated.



pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

THE pi2-fgolf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

THE REASON:

If a NORMAL round were calculated and included then it is quite possible that a player could always be in the top half each round and end up winning the competition

without actually participating.

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

#### TOO MANY PARTICIPANTS

Obviously (unless entry is restricted) the number of participants is likely to be such that it does not allow the field to be reduced progressively by half until only one remains  
e.g. 100

1, 2, 4, 8, 16, 32, 64, 128, 256, 512.....

The field needs to be reduced to 64 for this to happen so the website will create a PRELIMINARY ROUND to remove the excess 36 ( $100 - 64 = 36$ )

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

#### TOO MANY PARTICIPANTS (100)

The website will RANDOMLY select 72 players ( $36 \times 2$ ) to participate in this Preliminary Round and only scorecards for these will be available for selection.

The remaining 28 players will automatically go through to the First round of the competition.

Once the scorecards of these 72 have been selected the top half (36) will join the other 28 to contest the First round of 64

## pi2-golf COMPETITIONS

### THE pi2-golf KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION

#### TOO MANY PARTICIPANTS (45)

13 too many for a round of 32 players

The website will RANDOMLY select 26 players ( $13 \times 2$ ) to participate in this Preliminary Round and only scorecards for these will be available for selection.

The remaining 19 players will automatically go through to the First round of the competition.

Once the scorecards of these 26 have been selected the top half (13) will join the other 19 to contest the First round of 32

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS

Restrict Fundraising Competitions to the Original pi2-fgolf format

Use ACTUAL IMPROVEMENT RESULTS to identify the winner(s)

Where possible apply the suggested parameters – same date/course

Set a minimum number of scorecards that must be available each round from which to select one

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### ADDITIONAL COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS

#### SINGLE ROUND COMPETITION

Additional Suggestion 1 One month's duration

- i) Players must have a minimum of 3<sup>+</sup> pi2-fgolf assessments during that month.  
*This ensures a degree of FAIRNESS with regards to the submission of scorecards*
- ii) Choose a random date and select one assessment from each player on, or nearest to, that date.

## pi2-fgolf COMPETITIONS

### ADDITIONAL COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS

#### MULTI-ROUND COMPETITION

Additional Suggestion 2 Monthly Rounds

- i) Players must have a minimum of 3 pi2-fgolf assessments each month.
- ii) At the end of each month choose a random date and select one assessment from each player on, or nearest to, that date.

*This would lend itself ideally to a 12-round competition running throughout the whole calendar year.*

*Impose your own rule for months where inclement weather restricts play.*

### ADDITIONAL COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS

#### MULTI-COMPETITIONS

WHERE PARTICIPATION NUMBERS EXCEED 128

Create 2 or more competitions consisting of an equal number of participants (+/- 1)

#### IDENTIFYING AN OVERALL WINNER

Invite the top 15\* players from each to participate in a new competition

Either:

- Apply the same scorecards for each player as selected in the original competitions to establish who would have come top.
- Run a further monthly round selecting new scorecard assessments

### ADDITIONAL COMPETITION SUGGESTIONS

#### MULTI-COMPETITIONS

12-round competition running throughout the whole calendar year.

If participation numbers require more than one competition then:

At the end of the 11<sup>th</sup> round/month

Create a new single-round competition inviting the top 7\* of each to enter a deciding final round over the last month

\* Base this on the number of prizes
